



Dwarf Rhododendrons by Peter A. Cox: 296 pages, Published in 1973 in association with the Royal Horticultural Society in Britain.

From the dust jacket: “The author’s authoritative text, which includes a complete descriptive list of species and hybrids, is a magnificently illustrated by coloured plates and line drawings by Margaret Stones and by almost 50 photographs.”

Peter has authored several other rhododendron books, some of which are in our library. There are several chapters I particularly found informative. These were site selection, preparation with regard to soil type, shade and companion planting, planting and maintenance. He

comments on fertilization particularly the augmentation of nitrogen if sawdust (read here bark mulch) is used. Although nearly fifty years old, I think in information is timeless.
